Dr. Hans H. Stein is a professor of nutrition at the University of Illinois. His research focusses on energy and nutrient digestibility in humans and pigs as well as mineral nutrition in pigs. Dr. Stein has published more than 200 peer-reviewed manuscripts. He was also a member of the committee that was invited by the National Academies to write the 11th revised edition of Nutrient Requirements of Swine.
